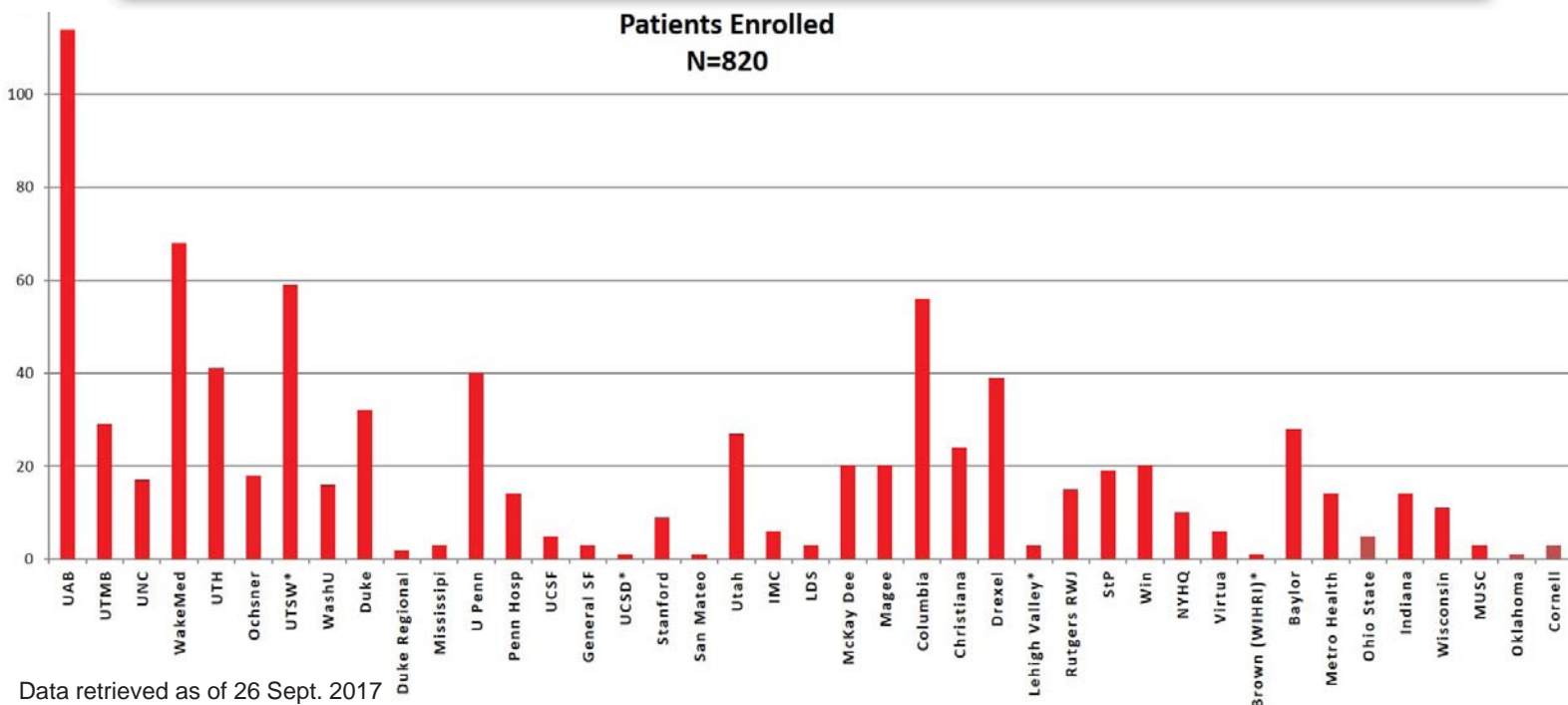

Updates/Reminders



- Please use NifedipineER as the first-line medication for patients who have no contraindication(s). There is a large supply still left in stock that will be expiring soon.
- Patients randomized to the Standard Care “No Treatment” group: If taking medication, they must discontinue use of medication the day of randomization (Please make sure you are informing patients during the consenting process). If not taking medication, do not start medication.
- Specimen label numbers are linked to patients. Use/assign specimen labels only if samples are collected.
- Don't forget to check the eDES Document Library when you need information. Various documents for patient tracking, IRB submissions, tools, certifications/instructions, etc. are maintained there and updated periodically.
- When completing the F01 Screening and Randomization form, please be sure to carefully review the full list of Exclusions (items 5-31) before documenting an exclusion under Q31c “If other/Specify”. There are a number of records in the database that for Q31c show “GA greater than 23 weeks” - This exclusion, for example, should be documented under Q27. There are also a number of records that show “BP too high”. There are items on the form for documenting these cases without using Q31c.

Friendly Reminder

Do you need screening support and your site has the EPIC EMR system? If so, perhaps you can get email alerts when a patient presents with an elevated BP. For assistance contact your IT Research Analyst and share the information below:

It falls into the realm of a “BPA” that has the popup suppressed, and instead routes the message to a predetermined pool of users.

Request the following basic parameters be set up for the alert:

- Specific locations in epic where these patients were being seen (specified prenatal clinics)
- Female
- Active pregnancy episode
- Age 18 and older
- Gestational age of <23 weeks
- Systolic BP of greater than or equal to 140 and/or diastolic BP of greater than or equal to 90
